<p><u>VS. 5a: Reasons for War</u> According to the Declaration of Independence, the authority to govern belongs to...</p>	the people, not kings							
<p><u>VS. 5a: Reasons for War</u> The Declaration of Independence says that...</p>	-all people are created equal -all people have the rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness							
<p><u>VS. 5b: Roles Played by Virginians</u> Who wrote the Declaration of Independence?</p>	Thomas Jefferson							
<p><u>VS. 5b: Roles Played by Virginians</u> How did Virginian patriots participate in the American Revolution?</p>	-served in the Continental Army -fought for independence, leading to the British surrender at Yorktown.							
<p><u>VS. 5b: Roles Played by Virginians</u> TRUE OR FALSE: All Virginians had the same beliefs and loyalties during the American Revolution.</p>	FALSE: -Some were neutral (in the middle) -Some were loyal (loyalists) to Great Britain.							

<p><u>VS. 5b: Roles Played by Virginians</u> How did women take more responsibility to support the war?</p>	
<p><u>VS. 5b: Roles Played by Virginians</u> Why did some enslaved African Americans fight?</p>	A better chance at freedom
<p><u>VS. 5b: Roles Played by Virginians</u> Whose side were the American Indians on?</p>	-Some fought alongside the Virginia patriots, some fought with the British.
<p><u>VS. 5b: Roles Played by Virginians</u> How was George Washington involved in the American Revolution?</p>	-He was the commander-in-chief of the Continental Army.
<p><u>VS. 5b: Roles Played by Virginians</u> What famous line is Patrick Henry known for proclaiming?</p>	"...give me liberty, or give me death."
<p><u>VS. 5b: Roles Played by Virginians</u> Who was James Lafayette?</p>	He was an enslaved African American from Virginia who served in the Continental Army and successfully obtained his freedom after the war.
<p><u>VS. 5c: Great Bridge, Jack Jouett, Yorktown</u> Why was the Battle of Great Bridge important?</p>	-First land battle of the American Revolution to be fought in Virginia. -The American victory forced the British colonial governor to flee to the city of Norfolk.
<p><u>VS. 5c: Great Bridge, Jack Jouett, Yorktown</u> What did Jack Jouett prevent?</p>	-the capture of important members of the Virginia General Assembly -He rode horseback to Charlottesville to warn Thomas Jefferson that the British were coming to arrest him and members of the General Assembly.
<p><u>VS. 5c: Great Bridge, Jack Jouett, Yorktown</u> Why was the battle at Yorktown, Virginia important?</p>	It was where the last battle of the Revolutionary War was fought.
<p><u>VS. 5c: Great Bridge, Jack Jouett, Yorktown</u> What happened at the battle of Yorktown?</p>	The British army surrendered, which led to the end of the war.
