VS 2d: American Indian Language Groups Where did American Indians live in Virginia?	All areas of the state
VS 2d: American Indian Language Groups Why were early Virginians called “Indians”?	Christopher Columbus called the people he found in the lands he explored “Indians” because he thought he was in the Indies (near China).
VS 2d: American Indian Language Groups How do we know about the way people lived?	<u>Artifacts</u> such as arrowheads, pottery, and other tools that have been found tell a lot about the people who lived in Virginia
VS 2d: American Indian Language Groups Where was the Algonquian language spoken? Which tribe was part of this language group?	Algonquian languages were spoken primarily in the Tidewater region; the Powhatan were part of this group.

<p>VS 2d: American Indian Language Groups</p> <p>Where was the Iroquoian language spoken?</p> <p>Which tribe was part of this language group?</p>	<p><u>Iroquoian</u> languages were spoken in Southwestern Virginia and in Southern Virginia near what is today North Carolina; the Cherokee were part of this group</p>
<p>VS 2e:Environment</p> <p>What is the climate of Virginia? What kind of vegetation (plants) do we have?</p>	<p>The climate in Virginia is relatively mild with distinct seasons—spring, summer, fall, and winter—resulting in a variety of vegetation.</p>
<p>VS 2e:Environment</p> <p>Why were Virginia’s Indians called “Eastern Woodland Indians”?</p>	<p>Forests used to cover most of Virginia.</p>
<p>VS 2e:Environment</p> <p>How did native peoples get their food in the winter?</p>	<p>In winter, they hunted birds and other animals and lived on stored foods from the previous fall.</p>

<p>VS 2e:Environment</p> <p>How did native peoples get their food in the spring?</p>	<p>In spring, they hunted, fished, and picked berries.</p>
<p>VS 2e:Environment</p> <p>How did native peoples get their food in the summer?</p>	<p>In summer, they grew crops (e.g., beans, corn, squash).</p>
<p>VS 2e:Environment</p> <p>How did native peoples get their food in the fall?</p>	<p>In fall, they harvested crops and hunted for foods to preserve and keep for the winter.</p>
<p>VS 2e:Environment</p> <p>What did native peoples use for clothing?</p>	<p>Animal skins (deerskin)</p>
<p>VS 2e:Environment</p> <p>What did native peoples use for shelter?</p>	<p>Shelter was made from materials found around them. They made homes using natural resources</p>
<p>VS 2f: Werowocomoco and Jamestown</p> <p>What do archaeologists do?</p>	<p>They study all kinds of material (artifacts) left by people from the past to understand how people lived.</p>

<p>VS 2f: Werowocomoco and Jamestown</p> <p>What was Werowocomoco?</p>	<p>Werowocomoco was large Indian town use by Indian leaders for several hundred years before the English settlers came. It was the headquarters of the leader Powhatan in 1607.</p>
<p>VS 2f: Werowocomoco and Jamestown</p> <p>What was the first permanent ENGLISH settlement in North America?</p>	<p>Jamestown</p>
<p>VS 2g:Current State-Recognized Tribes</p> <p>Do American Indians still live in Virginia today?</p>	<p>American Indian people have lived in Virginia for thousands of years, well before 1607, and continue to live in all parts of Virginia today.</p>
<p>VS 2g:Current State-Recognized Tribes</p> <p>Where are current state-recognized tribes located?</p>	<p><u>Coastal Plain (Tidewater) region:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Chickahominy Tribe • Eastern Chickahominy Tribe • Mattaponi Tribe • Nansemond Tribe • Pamunkey Tribe • Rappahannock Tribe • Upper Mattaponi Tribe <p><u>Piedmont region:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Monacan Tribe
