<p>VS.7a Division and West Virginia How would you describe the economy in the southern part of the United States?</p>	<p>It was agriculture (farming). It relied on slave labor.</p>
<p>VS.7a Division and West Virginia Why did the northern and southern states disagree about the new states in the western territories?</p>	<p>The northern states wanted them to be “free states,” and the southern states wanted them to be “slave states.”</p>
<p>VS.7a Division and West Virginia What did Nat Turner do?</p>	<p>He led a revolt against plantation owners in Virginia.</p>
<p>VS.7a Division and West Virginia What were abolitionists?</p>	<p>People who were AGAINST slavery</p>
<p>VS.7a Division and West Virginia What was the “Underground Railroad” that Harriet Tubman supported?</p>	<p>A secret route that escaped African Americans used to flee north.</p>
<p>VS.7a Division and West Virginia What did John Brown do?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -He led a raid on the US Amory (arsenal—where they kept <i>weapons</i>). -He was trying to start a slave rebellion. -He was captured and hanged.
<p>VS.7a Division and West Virginia What happened after Abraham Lincoln was elected president in 1860?</p>	<p>Some southern states seceded (broke away) from the UNION and formed the “CONFEDERATE STATES OF AMERICA.” Later, Virginia also seceded and joined them.</p>
<p>VS.7a Division and West Virginia Why did conflict grow within Virginia?</p>	<p>-The eastern counties of Virginia relied on slavery, and the western counties did not favor slavery.</p>
<p>VS.7a Division and West Virginia What happened because the eastern counties of Virginia relied on slavery, and the western counties did not favor slavery?</p>	<p>West Virginia was created.</p>

<p><u>VS.7b Virginia's Role in the Civil War</u> Who played a major role in The Battle of Bull Run?</p>	<p>General Thomas "Stonewall" Jackson</p>
<p><u>VS.7b Virginia's Role in the Civil War</u> Who defeated Union troops at Fredericksburg, VA?</p>	<p>General Robert E. Lee, Commander of the Army of Northern Virginia</p>
<p><u>VS.7b Virginia's Role in the Civil War</u> What was the capital of the Confederacy?</p>	<p>Richmond</p>
<p><u>VS.7b Virginia's Role in the Civil War</u> What happened to Richmond toward the end of the war?</p>	<p>It fell to Union General Ulysses S. Grant and was burned near the end of the war.</p>
<p><u>VS.7b Virginia's Role in the Civil War</u> What important sea battle took place in the water near Norfolk and Hampton, Virginia?</p>	<p>The battle of the Monitor (Union) and the Merrimack (Confederacy). No one won, the battle was fought to a draw.</p>
<p><u>VS.7b Virginia's Role in the Civil War</u> What did President Lincoln use to blockade southern ports?</p>	<p>The Union navy</p>
<p><u>VS.7b Virginia's Role in the Civil War</u> Where did the Civil War end? (who, what, when)</p>	<p>--General Robert E. Lee surrendered his army to Union General Ulysses S. Grant --Appomattox Court House, Virginia --April 1865</p>

<p><u>VS.7c Roles Played by Whites, Enslaved & Free African Americans, American Indians</u></p> <p>What role did enslaved African Americans play?</p>	<p>--The Confederate army relied on enslaved African Americans to raise crops and provide labor for the army. --Some fled to the Union army and some fought for the Union.</p>
<p><u>VS.7c Roles Played by Whites, Enslaved & Free African Americans, American Indians</u></p> <p>What did some free African Americans feel?</p>	<p>They felt their limited rights could best be protected by supporting the Confederacy.</p>
<p><u>VS.7c Roles Played by Whites, Enslaved & Free African Americans, American Indians</u></p> <p>Which side were the American Indians on?</p>	<p>Most American Indians did not take sides during the Civil War.</p>
